





2016 District-Wide Collection Schedule

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) & Ag Chemicals Collection



- Paint, strippers, varnishes, pool chemicals, and household cleaners
- Adhesives, garden sprays, pesticides, and ag. chemicals
- Aerosol cans and fluorescent light bulbs
- Batteries, antifreeze, and brake fluid.
- **Only small quantities of items associated with residential homes.**
- **NOT ACCEPTED:** explosives, pressurized cylinders, ammunition, motor oil, infectious waste (medical) & prescription drugs. The District has the right to refuse service, even if not listed.
- **NO BULK OR COMMERCIAL BUSINESS WASTE WILL BE ACCEPTED**

Electronics Recycling Collection

The management of discarded electronic devices is a growing concern. Lead, for example is found in computer monitors. With the average computer monitor containing 5 lbs of lead, one can see the importance of recycling e-waste.

Accepted for recycling: Televisions, radios, stereo equipment, camera, small appliances, computers, computer monitors, fax machines, printers, copiers, microwaves, gaming consoles, controllers, vacuums, coffee makers, toasters, irons, vcrs and dvd players.

Not Accepted: Smoke alarms, white goods (washers, dryers, dishwashers, stoves, refrigerators, freezers), Batteries, Freon containing items (air conditioners, dehumidifiers)



Follow these easy steps to recycle.
Accepted Materials, Preparation and Not Accepted as listed below.

Materials accepted can vary from community to community. Check your local recycling programs for specifics on materials accepted.

Materials	Accepted	How To Prepare	Not Accepted
Glass 	Only food and beverage jars and bottles. Brown, green or clear	Rinse. Remove lid. Label may stay on. Please do not break.	Window glass, Pyrex, light bulbs, dishes, ceramics or mirrors.
Plastic 	Milk, water and juice jugs, any color soda bottles, soap & detergent bottles. All #1-7 in the triangle on the bottom Ok.	Rinse. Remove lids. Labels may stay on. Flatten to save space.	Flowerpots or motor oil containers
Aluminum & Tin Cans 	Aluminum cans and steel cans	Rinse. Flatten to save space.	Aluminum foil, construction material or demolition material
Cardboard 	Corrugated cardboard and food boxes,	Flatten. Remove tape, staples and string from shipping cartons	Wet cardboard.
Newspapers Magazines & Catalogs 	All clean, dry newsprint, including inserts. All magazines and catalogs, including phonebooks.	Keep dry. Stack in brown paper or plastic bags; also can be tied together.	Wet, dirty or sun bleached paper.
Plastic Bags & Shrink/Stretch Wrap	All Wal-Mart & Grocery plastic bags & shrink/stretch wrap. Bread & bun bags	Bag together	Black Trash Bags
New – Styrofoam	Meat trays, egg cartons, packing material, cups, plates	Bag together	Dirty containers

PLEASE DO NOT DEPOSIT HOUSEHOLD TRASH INTO COLLECTION CONTAINERS.
